Madison Holleran Mental Health Action Scholarship Eligibility and Contest Rules

Sponsor

This scholarship contest ("Contest") is sponsored by Effective School Solutions, 25 Deforest Avenue, Summit, NJ 07901 and the Madison Holleran Foundation, 100 Homewood Avenue, Allendale, NJ 07401 ("Sponsor"). All decisions by Sponsor regarding eligibility, award, and compliance with the rules of the Contest are final.

Eligibility

- 1. The Contest is open to all students who will be seniors in a high school in New Jersey in an academic program designed to conclude with the awarding of a diploma during the 2019-2020 school year.
- 2. Applicants must be 16 years of age or older at the time of entry and submit the attached eligibility form at time of entry. Applicants below the age of 18 at time of entry must have a parent or guardian sign the eligibility form giving their consent to the applicant's participation. Any parent or guardian giving such consent is equally bound by all Contest Rules.
- 3. Employees of Sponsor, their family members, and persons living in the same household as employees or family members are not eligible.
- 4. Void where prohibited by law.
- 5. One entry is allowed per person. If the Sponsor determines that an applicant has submitted more than one entry, under one or multiple identities, all of that applicant's entries will be disqualified.
- 6. No prize will be awarded to applicants who do not meet the eligibility requirements. All information on the entry form must be accurate and complete.

How to Enter

- 1. Entrants must submit a 1,000-word essay about an innovative mental health support program that can be implemented at their high school and throughout the state of New Jersey. Essay must be submitted in a pdf format.

Timing

1. The Entry Period begins at 12:01 am Eastern Time on October 7th, 2019 and ends at 11:59 pm on December 31st, 2019.

2. Incomplete submissions or submissions received outside of the Entry Period will not be considered.

Judging Criteria

- 1. All eligible submissions will be judged on the following criteria:
 - a. Originality and Creativity 30%.
 - b. Relation to the topic 30%.
 - c. Implementation of idea 10%
 - d. Clarity of writing 15%
 - e. Grammar, punctuation, and spelling 15%
- 2. Entries will be judged base on those criteria by a panel of judges from Effective School Solutions and the Madison Holleran Foundation.
- 3. Judging will be blind, and Judges will not be informed of any personally identifying or descriptive information about the author of the essay.
- 4. Judges will make their decisions on or before January 31st, 2020.

Prizes

- 1. Four (4) scholarships will be awarded to the four eligible participants with the highest Judges' scores.
- 2. Each scholarship is worth \$2000.00. Total value of all scholarships -- \$8000.00.
- 3. The award will be provided by check to the winner. If winner is a minor, the award will be provided to the winner's parent or guardian as custodian to the winner.
- 4. Any taxes or other costs or fees due on the scholarships are the sole responsibility of the winner and/or their parent or guardian.
- 5. Payment of scholarships is contingent upon verification that the applicant meets all eligibility requirements and confirms agreement and compliance with all rules of the Contest.
- 6. Winners will be selected by the Judges on or before January 31st, 2020. The Judges' decisions are final.

Notification of Winners

- 1. Winners will be notified on or before February 7th, 2020. Winners will also be announced on the Sponsor's website www.effectiveschoolsolutions.com on or before February 7th, 2020.
- 2. Once notified, winners will have fifteen (15) business days to respond to Sponsor and provide an Affidavit of Eligibility and a Publicity/Liability release signed by winner and, where required, their parent or guardian.

- 3. If Sponsor is unable to contact a winner or receives no response within that period, the prize may be forfeited and awarded to the applicant with the next-highest score.
- 4. Applicants are required to notify sponsor of any changes in contact information.
